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Many medium-sized and large businesses actively encourage volunteerism within universities. Since 2004, Enterprise Futures Network (EFN) has offered a program that matches volunteer mentors from companies to entrepreneurial programs and business plan competitions throughout the World, including at Columbia University, Duke, Indian School of Business, Rice University, Stanford University, UC Berkeley, University of Michigan, and the University of Washington.

EFN is a 501 (c) (3) non-profit organization that educates student entrepreneurs by providing mentor-based programs. Our 200 mentors and subject matter experts take great pride in giving back to students.

Our company volunteer program connects company employees to rewarding student mentoring opportunities. EFN's program requires six to eight hours of time from each volunteer over two months. We enroll volunteers either as mentors or associate mentors or subject matter experts. Mentors must have at least 7 years of experience in business management, finance, investing, or strategy. Associate mentors (or subject matter experts) must have substantial experience in a specific topic(s) that they will mentor on such as marketing, a technology area, or legal or other issues.
